The Mission of St. Louis Faith Formation is "To teach as Jesus did forming disciples of Christ."

Our purpose, guided by the Holy Spirit is to provide spiritual growth through:

- *Scripture & Tradition—guiding families toward an understanding and love of the Gospel message.
- *Doctrine—encouraging families to gain an understanding of the history & knowledge of the richness of the Catholic faith.
- *Liturgy/Prayer—assisting families by providing a variety of prayer & worship experiences for them to participate in.
- *Morality/Christian Living—nurturing families in values & virtues.
- *Service—empowering families to work for social justice & serve those in need as Jesus did.

Through our core values we strive to cultivate the faith and form disciples.

- *Reverence for the Word of God is fostered.
- *Doctrine & History of the Catholic faith is presented both as knowledge to be learned and as a life to be lived.
- *Prayer is important for growth in spiritual life: liturgy/Mass, prayer services, personal prayer, Lectio Divina, the Rosary, etc.
- *Values & Virtues are fostered and lived in everyday life.
- *The Gospel message and moral life expressed in the Ten Commandments, Beatitudes, Corporal & Spiritual Works of Mercy are professed, cultivated and practiced in everyday life.
- *Sacramental life is central to developing the Catholic faith.

Polices Continued

- *Behavior/Discipline
 —Students are expected to be courteous and to be reasonably quiet, conducive to a fair learning environment for everyone. Disrespect for self, classmates or catechists will be reported to staff. If necessary, parents may be called to discuss behavior with the Faith Formation staff.
- *Alcohol/Drugs/Tobacco
 —The procession, sale or use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco or any other controlled substances on the parish grounds, property, or while participating in a parish sponsored event is strictly forbidden. Parents and/or guardians will be notified and violations will be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
- *Firearms/ Weapons, Dangerous Objects
 —Any object brought to the faith formation programs that would endanger the safety of any or all participants is prohibited and the offender is subject to discipline and expulsion procedures. Parent and/or guardians will be notified and violations will be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

*Classroom Session Requirements:

<u>Diocesan curriculum guidelines</u> state content should be covered in a 30-35 hour program.

<u>Arrival for sessions:</u> Students should not arrive for sessions until 10 minutes before they begin. Parents should drop them off at the door. They will be greeted by staff and directed where to go. Catechists will meet their students at the classroom door. Parents are welcome to walk their students to their rooms, if desired.

<u>Dismissal:</u> Parents in Grades 3-6 are asked to wait outside for their students. The catechist will bring the class outside, they will wait with the class until each student is picked up. Parents in Grades 1 & 2 are welcome to wait outside the classroom. Grade 1 will be released first, then second, third, etc.

Policies

*Attendance is very important. Parents are asked to notify their student's coordinator of absences from class or early dismissal by phone or written notice.

*To be eligible for Confirmation, students must attend sessions regularly.

*Make-up Assignments, when your are absent it is expected that make-up work will be completed prior to the next session.

<u>*Inclement weather</u> policy is when Luxemburg— Casco School District cancels school, or calls off early, sessions are also cancelled. If you are unsure of a cancellation, please contact your child's coordinator.

*Regular participation in the life of the parish is expected of all Catholic students in such activities as Mass, Sacraments, service, etc. Attendance is the responsibility of the parents as parents are the primary spiritual teachers.

*Hand held electronic devices are to be turned off during sessions unless directed by leader. All devices must also be turned off during prayer and when in Church. Youth who abuse this will be asked to turn them in and parents will be contacted.

*Harassment policy: It is the policy of the programs governed by the Diocesan Board of Total Catholic Education to maintain a learning and working environment that is free from any sexual harassment or any other type of harassment. No employee, volunteer, or student associated with these programs shall be subject to any sexual harassment or any other type of harassment. It shall be a violation of this policy for any employee, volunteer, or student to harass another employee, volunteer, or student.

*Dress Code: All clothing should reflect the values and morals of our Catholic beliefs. It is the police of the Diocese of Green Bay that all students, staff, and volunteers must follow the dress code expectations of the biological sex while on premises for classes, Confirmation preparation or youth ministry and while representing the parish or program at outside functions. Clothing with inappropriate sayings, images, bare midriffs, low cut, as well as inappropriate accessories are not permitted. If a youth arrives wearing inappropriate attire, we will discuss it, if it occurs again a warning will be issued, then parents will be notified.

Participation in the Faith Formation program is only one part of the family's responsibility. At Baptism, you as parents and godparents, promised to bring your child up in the Catholic faith; that means teaching him/her to pray, how to worship and how to serve others.
