#### JULY 6, 2025

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Shepherd's Thoughts (July 6, 2025)

In the midst of war between Israel and Iran, how do we better understand this passage from the prophet Isaiah in the first reading in today's present situation where numerous people are suffering, numbers of death are accelerating, and destruction is evident in their homeland? "Lo, I will spread prosperity over Jerusalem like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing torrent."

How can the people in the promised land possibly feel the presence of God these days? How can their minds absorb that God is comforting them like they are in a mother's arms as it is written, "As nurslings, you shall be carried in her arms, and fondled in her lap; as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; in Jerusalem you shall find your comfort" (Is 66:10-14c).

The virtue of hope keeps us even stronger to always cling to the grace of God and because of His love and mercy, He will still protect His chosen people and give the best that He can to save them from the hands of their enemies.

No matter what happens, Our Responsorial Psalm continuously calls for us to express our utmost gratitude and praise to God. It depicts His kindness and goodness to His people in good times and in bad, as it is written, "Hear now, all you who fear God, while I declare what He has done for me. Blessed be God who refused me not my prayer or His kindness!" (Ps 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20).

The cross is highlighted by St. Paul in our second reading today urging us to focus on Jesus' passion and death rather than worldly perceptions and possessions. This is precisely a profound statement of Paul calling all of us to bear the name of Jesus in the midst of conflicts and divisions. Furthermore, he challenges us to imitate Jesus as we lovingly bear our sufferings in union with Him. In this passage, we are also reminded of the new creation in us through Jesus' death calling us to give glory and praise for the sacrifice Christ has done for us, as it is written, "From now on, let no one make troubles for me; for I bear the marks of Jesus on my body" (Gal 6:14-18).

The Gospel presented to us today by St. Luke beautifully expresses how Jesus has entrusted His ministry to His chosen men. His instructions were laid out to them so that they know, with clarity and precision, how to go about their mission. Jesus as well, revealed to them that they act on His behalf, thus, their works are full of God's grace . As it is written, "Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you" (Lk 10:1-12, 17-20 or 10:1-9).

Coming together as one family in Christ, may we set our hearts with the desire to serve God; withstanding the challenges that come along our way. And in this Jubilee Year of Hope, may we embrace our crosses with love, hoping in God's mercy and believing in its transformative power through Jesus Christ.
